

Our Lady of Hope Parish, Salford Third Sunday of Lent - 24 March 2019

"The man who thinks he is safe must be careful he does not fall." This is the theme of this Sunday: it underlines the need for repentance, which is the focus of our Lenten journey in Year C. Jesus, in the Gospel, uses two recent events in order to illustrate his point about sin and repentance - there is a price to be paid for sin, but there is a way of avoiding it: if we repent, we will have salvation and a new and real freedom. This idea is emphasised in the parable, where we see a tree not being condemned immediately, but given a chance to change and produce fruit. So are we. This links in with the two other readings, which also talk about escape - the escape of Israel from Egypt. This is to be a warning for us, as Saint Paul says: if we are Christians, we must live as Christians, and be aware of the need to watch our lives and the direction they are taking.

Marriage Matters: What's in a name? Yahweh means 'I am who I am'. Names bring to mind the person, and what they mean to you. Our God – Three Persons, created me, loves me, redeemed me, makes me holy, and is compassionate, merciful and forgiving. Just as MY Jack, MY Jill has shown me the same love, we have tried to show it to our children.

Think Vocation: "The Lord God of your Fathers has sent me to you." Whenever we encounter a priest or Religious, we need to remember that they have been called by Our Lord and sent to serve us. God works in all sorts of different ways that are often beyond our understanding. May we treat those sent to us by God with the utmost respect and give them our fullest support.

Sunday Mass Times: Thank you to those who completed a response form for our recent consultation. Disappointingly, there was still only a 37% response (278 votes out of an average 747 Mass attendance) and the voting was inconclusive, with three of the options scoring almost identically. Consequently, this matter was the main business for the Parish Leadership Team meeting on Wednesday night and we had to make a decision based on other factors.

With regard to the Saturday evening Mass, we took note of the fact that the majority of those who currently attend one or other of our Saturday evening Masses preferred that it remain at **6.30pm (at SL)**, so that was agreed. For the Sunday morning Masses, we took note of the many comments that an 11.30am Mass would be too late (especially to preserve the Children's Liturgy) and so we opted for the pattern of **8am (SsPP)**, **9.30am (SL) & 11am (SsPP)**.

This new pattern of Masses has been approved by Bishop John and will take effect on the first weekend in April when he is due to come on visitation to the parish.

Easter Triduum: Now that we are one parish, it is right that we should have just one celebration of the Easter Triduum, though we will make use of both churches. This was discussed at the Parish Leadership Team meeting on Wednesday and we agreed to the following arrangements. The Mass of the Lord's Supper on Maundy Thursday will be at 7.30pm at Ss Peter & Paul, followed by watching at the Altar of Repose until 10pm. The Good Friday Celebration of the Lord's Passion will be at 3pm at St Luke's. The Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday will also take place at St Luke's at 8pm. The Masses on Easter Sunday morning will follow our new pattern (8am at SsPP, 9.30am at SL, 11am at SsPP).
