This weekend we have the opportunity to focus on spreading the

Parish Meeting:

Many thanks to all those who attended the Mass (100+) and the
meeting (about 90) on Wednesday evening, with a good spread
from both parishes. We had a great celebration, acknowledging
around 30 different ministries and activities that already serve and
build up our parish communities. Our task now is to develop these
and add more to them as we move forward with Hope in the
Future.

Amalgamation:

As part of the meeting, we considered what is involved in the
process of amalgamating our two parishes into one. It was agreed
that we should not delay with this process but should ask the
bishop to launch the formal period of consultation soon. That
formal consultation will involve us in considering the parish
boundaries, the pastoral provision within the proposed new parish
and the name that might be given to our new parish (with the two
churches retaining their current names). There will be plenty of
opportunity during that consultation for parishioners to express
their views.

Fr Mark Paver:

The bishop has appointed Fr Mark to be an assistant priest to our
two parishes, alongside Fr Michael and Fr David. Although
Fr Mark was ordained last year, he returned to Rome to complete
some further studies and so this will be his first appointment in the
diocese since his ordination. He will be joining us next weekend
and will be resident at St Luke's. Let us be sure to give him a
warm welcome.
